

Mary Robinson

Biography: Mary Robinson is an Irish lawyer, politician, and diplomat who served as president of Ireland (1990–93), the first woman to hold that post. She later was United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights (UNHCHR; 1997–2002). Robinson was the recipient of numerous *honoris*: in 2004 Amnesty International awarded her its Ambassador of Conscience award for her human rights work, and she later received the U.S. Presidential Medal of Freedom (2009). Robinson's memoir, *Everybody Matters: My Life Giving Voice* (co-written with Tessa Robinson), was published in 2012.

- At 25, Mary Robinson became Ireland's youngest professor of law when she was appointed Reid Professor of Constitutional and Criminal Law at Trinity College.

- "I was elected by the women of Ireland, who instead of rocking the cradle, rocked the system."




